ID AYU0259) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 40 seats (instead of 42 seats) in 07 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Ayurved Samhita, Siddhant – 06 seats ii) Rachna Sharir – 05 seats (instead of 06 seats) iii) Kriya Sharir – 06 seats iv) Kayachikitsa – 06 seats v) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 05 seats (instead of 06 seats) vi) Shalya tantra – 06 seats vii) Kaumarbhritya – Bala Roga – 06 seats for the academic session 2024-25 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

#### Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

- 1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Shri Anand Niketan Dharmshala Avom Dharmik Trust, Shri Dhanwantri Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Centre 27 k.m milestone, Mathura-Delhi Highway Mathura NH-19, Chhata, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0259), inspection of your College was conducted on 05.02.2024 & 06.02.2024 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Asessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 42 seats in 07 PG courses in the subject namely i) Ayurved Samhita, Siddhant 06 seats ii) Rachna Sharir 06 seats iii) Kriya Sharir 06 seats iv) Kayachikitsa 06 seats v) Prasuti & Stri Roga 06 seats vi) Shalya tantra 06 seats vii) Kaumarbhritya Bala Roga 06 seats for the academic session 2024-25.
- 2. Further, the hearing with regard to faculty suspected to be working only on paper but physically not present was conducted on 04.07.2024 and recommendation of the hearing committee were placed in the 92<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 31.05.2024. The same was approved that six of your faculty who was suspected to be working only on paper, namely Dr. Milind Shantappa Yadahalli (AYPK00852), Dr. Priya Gharge (AYPS00426), Dr. Jayshree Bhimrao Kamble (AYRS00855), Dr. Swapna Suresh Surshetwar (AYKS00213), Dr. Ashish Dadarao ghurde (AYRS01094) and Dr. Girraj Upadhyay (AYDG01202) cannot be considered as regular teacher and same was communicated to you vide letter ref. no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2024 dated 02.07.2024. Further, reverification of documents with regard to faculty found to be working only on paper conducted on 07.08.2024 and recommendation of the hearing committee were placed in the 104<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 28.08.2024. The same was approved that two of your faculty found to be regular, namely: 1. Dr. Girraj Upadhyay (AYDG01202) and 2. Dr. Swapna Suresh Surshetwar (AYKS00213) and revised letter was communicated to you vide letter ref. no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2024 dated 30.08.2024.
- 3. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified and approved criteria due to the following shortcoming:-

a) Availability of teaching staff in existing PG departments:-

12 faculties were suspected to be working on paper and called for virtual hearing. 06 out of 12 have been considered to be regular teachers. 06 faculties found on-paper.

- iv. Dr. Swapna Suresh Surshetwar (AYKS00213)- working as associate professor in Kriya Sharir (in excess)
- v. **Dr. Ashish Dadarao ghurde (AYRS01094)** working as assistant professor in Rachana Sharir (in excess)
- vi. Dr. Girraj Upadhyay (AYDG01202)- working as professor in Dravyagun Vigyan department

- b) Recovery room was not attached with Major OT.
- c) Few modern medicines in Pharmacy found expired.
- d) Details of teaching staff not displayed at the entrance of Departments.
- 4. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the 99<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 26.07.2024. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of even number dated 23.08.2024 to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on 28.08.2024, to present their case and to show cause as to why not the conditional permission to the college with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 42 seats in 07 PG courses in the subject namely i) Ayurved Samhita, Siddhant 06 seats, ii) Rachna Sharir 06 seats, iii) Kriya Sharir 06 seats, iv) Kayachikitsa 06 seats, v) Prasuti & Stri Roga 06 seats, vi) Shalyatantra 06 seats, vii) Kaumarbhritya Bala Roga 06 seats for the academic session 2024-25.
- The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter no. SDAMCRC/Q-13975/2024 Dated:-27.08.2024 against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Meeting was attended by Dr. Avaneesh Kumar Dwivedi, Principal of the college, appeared before the Hearing Committee on 28.08.2024 and made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

Committee checked with the board and found that 2 of the faculties namely Dr.Swapna Suresh Surshetwar (AYKS00213) and Dr.GirirajUpadhyay (AYDG01202) have been considered as regular after reverification of documents. Accordingly the satus of PG department as follows :-

- 6. Further, Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCSIM was in receipt of a letter vide ref no. SDAMCRC/Q-13992/2024 dated 31.08.2024 regarding the payment of imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 01 crore to your college in installment basis and same was placed in the 105<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCSIM held on 03.09.2024. Board accepted the request of the college and same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 05.09.2024. Further, the 1<sup>st</sup> installment of Rs. 25 Lakhs has been received through RTGS no. BARBH24244820223 dated 31.08.2024.
- 7. Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2022 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 105th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 03.09.2024.
- 8. The Board observed that the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission for UG (BAMS) course and PG Course in the subjects namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Siddhant 06 seats, ii) Kriya Sharir 06 seats, iii) Kayachikitsa 06 seats, iv) Shalya tantra 06 seats, v) Kaumarbhritya Bala Roga 06 seats and the college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission for PG Courses in the subjects namely (i) Rachna Sharir 06 seats and (ii) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga 06 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the Academic Session 2024-25. However, the Board decided to issue Conditional Permission for the PG course as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2024-25, wherein it is mentioned that:
  - a. "As per regulation 16,(1) & (2) of IMCC (Post Graduate Ayurvedic Education) regulations, 2016, the teacher-student ratio shall be such that the number of post-graduate teachers to the number of post-graduate students admitted per year is maintained as 1:3 in case of Professor and 1:2 in case of Reader or Associate Professor. The teacher student ratio shall be 1:1 in case of Lecturer or Assistant Professor having minimum of five years teaching experience."

Accordingly, as per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 105<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of MARBISM, college is not fulfilling the required teacher student ratio in the following department for PG:-

In the department of Rachana sharir (06 seats) - 01 Professors, 01 Associate Professors and 02 Assistant Professors are available and these 2 Assistant professors does not have the required experience of 05 years. There is a shortcoming of 1 Additional higher faculty. Hence, the college is fulfilling for 05 seats instead of 06 seats for PG in the department of Rachana sharir.

In the department of Prasuti & Stri roga (06 seats) - 01 Professors, 01 Associate Professors and 04 Assistant Professors are available and these 4 Assistant professors does not have the required experience of 05 years. There is a shortcoming of 1 Additional higher faculty. Hence, the college is fulfilling for **05 seats** instead of **06 seats** for PG in the department of **Prasuti & stri roga**.

Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2024-25 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 40 seats (instead of 42 seats) in 07 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Ayurved Samhita, Siddhant – 06 seats, ii) Rachna Sharir – 05 seats (instead of 06 seats), iii) Kriya Sharir – 06 seats, iv) Kayachikitsa – 06 seats, v) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 05 seats (instead of 06 seats), vi) Shalya tantra – 06 seats, vii) Kaumarbhritya – Bala Roga – 06 seats for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

- 9. Therefore, conditional permission is issued to Shri Anand Niketan Dharmshala Avom Dharmik Trust, Shri Dhanwantri Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Centre 27 k.m milestone, Mathura-Delhi Highway Mathura NH-19, Chhata, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0259) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 40 seats (instead of 42 seats) in 07 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Ayurved Samhita, Siddhant 06 seats, ii) Rachna Sharir 05 seats (instead of 06 seats), iii) Kriya Sharir 06 seats, iv) Kayachikitsa 06 seats, v) Prasuti & Stri Roga 05 seats (instead of 06 seats), vi) Shalya tantra 06 seats, vii) Kaumarbhritya Bala Roga 06 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 subject to the condition that college is fulfilling the following requirements: -
  - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
  - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 40 seats (instead of 42 seats) in 07 PG

courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 10. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 11. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 12. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 13. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2024 and compliance report should be submitted to the MARB-ISM, in order to be considered for the grant of conditional permission for the academic session 2025-2026:
  - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022;
  - iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Postgraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016;
  - v) The shortcoming mentioned in Point no. 5 above.
- 14. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
